9:30am	<p>Collins Street is home to heritage buildings and vibrant architecture</p> <p>Take a wander down Collins Street and you will find some of Melbourne's oldest and grandest buildings, which tell the story of Melbourne's history, from the height of the Gold Rush era to today.</p>
10:30am	<p>Visit Collins Street's Luxury Shopping Destinations</p> <p>At last count, over 25 flagship stores call the Collins Street Precinct home. At the Paris end of town (between Spring and Swanston Streets) you'll find brands like Hermes, Prada, Christian Louboutin, Cartier, Harrolds, A-ESQUE, Chanel, Fendi, BVLGARI, Berlutti, Longchamp, Louis Vuitton, Gucci, Versace and Bottega Veneta. Alongside shop-front boutiques, the Collins Street Precinct is home to a collection of sophisticated shopping centres and arcades - housing luxury shopping retailers and home-grown brands alike.</p> <p>St. Collins Lane embodies a mindset that resonates with the individual – an established set of attitudes for the style conscious, uninhibited, urban character. Marching to their unique beat. Welcoming visitors with a sophisticated shopping experience, St. Collins Lane houses fashion favourites including Coach, TAG Heuer, Zadig & Voltaire, Maje, Sandro, Reiss, Furla, MJ Bale, Rodd & Gunn, Birkenstock, CUE, Adolfo Dominguez, Claudie Pierlot, Lecia Camera & Gallery and Australia's flagship Debenhams store.</p> <p>St. Collins Lane 260 Collins St, Melbourne VIC 3000</p> <p>The Block Arcade (282 Collins St), open since 1892, has remained one of Melbourne's best-loved and most ornate shopping precincts. Home to the iconic Hopetoun Tea Rooms, in operation since the arcade was first built, the arcade boasts a soaring glass canopy and mosaic floors, which were inspired by Milan's famed Galleria Vittorio Emanuele. Enter from Collins Street and make your way through the dazzling interiors, checking out the bespoke tailors and jewellers, art dealers and spice merchants that inhabit this special piece of Melbourne. In the Block Arcade, you'll find the likes of Card and Caboodle, Creswick Wool, Essensorie and Melbourne's famed Hopetoun Tearooms.</p> <p>The Block Arcade 282 Collins St, Melbourne VIC 3000</p>

<p>1:30pm</p>	<p>Explore the historic T&G Building</p> <p>The T&G Building is one of Australia's most prestigious business addresses, Originally constructed in 1928, the T&G building completed refurbishment in 2018. The new-look T&G Building features dual entrances with access to Collins Street and the newly pedestrianised Ramsden Place embracing Melbourne's quintessential lane-way culture.</p> <p>T&G Building 161 Collins Street, Melbourne VIC 3000</p>
<p>2:30pm</p>	<p>Explore the New York end of Collins Street</p> <p><i>The 'newer' end of Collins Street is home to some exciting new developments and sites worth visiting. Top picks include:</i></p> <p>The new Melbourne's Quarter development (691 Collins Street) is home to Sky Park. Suspended above Collins Street and accessible via a dramatic staircase or the glass lifts located nearby, the majority of Sky Park is open-air, featuring lush green landscaping that allows visitors to soak up the sun in a wind protected environment. The first stage of Sky Park is now complete, the remainder of the Sky Park will be constructed in conjunction with Melbourne Quarter Tower.</p> <p>Built in 2016, Light House (888 Collins Street) is Melbourne's first real-time weather display. The 15-story residential development is wrapped in a luminous skin that interprets incoming weather and data, transforming it into beautiful digital visualisations. For five minutes on the hour, every hour (from dusk to midnight), a link to the Bureau of Meteorology's weather station provides a data feed that allow the lights to forecast the following day's weather, where moving lights reflect conditions such as rain, clouds, wind or sunshine.</p>
